Retired military, Michael J. Doria, Ph.D., MPH, MRC, MC is the former U.S. Coast Guard's Clinical Neuropsychologist and Program Manager of its Psychological Health (PH) and Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) Program.

Dr. Doria received a doctoral degree in counseling psychology and three master's degrees in counseling, rehabilitation counseling, and public health. In addition, he has satisfied the requirements to obtain both national and state credentials in the counseling profession as a Certified Rehabilitation Counselor (CRC), Licensed Professional Counselor (LPC), Licensed Mental Health Counselor (LMHC), Licensed Clinical Professional Counselor (LCPC), and a National Certified Counselor (NCC). With a specialization in neurorehabilitation and neuropsychology, Dr. Doria has trained and worked in a variety of public health facilities, including psychiatric, veterans, civilian, military and teaching hospitals, drug and alcohol treatment and job placement agencies, neurorehabilitation treatment clinics, colleges and universities, and developmental youth centers.

Upon retirement from the U.S. Military, Dr. Doria joined the New York Guard and was appointed as their Mental Health Specialist for the 244th Medical Command of New York Guard Headquarters.
